Stage 1 Preliminary Theological Certificate (PTC)

- 1. Introduction to the Bible:** An overview of the entire Bible, plus helpful hints on how to understand its main themes.
- 2. New Testament 1:** Exploring God's purposes in sending Christ. Getting to know Jesus through Mark's Gospel.
- 3. Old Testament 1:** What do the first five books of the Old Testament teach about God and his purposes?
- 4. Doctrine 1:** Exploring the Bible's teaching about God – how we get to know him, what he is like, what he has done for us.
- 5. Ephesians:** A big picture with cosmic dimensions of God and his world.

6. ELECTIVE 2: Choose one of the following modules:

- 6.1 Promise to Fulfilment:** Interpreting the Bible using a method grounded in biblical theology.
- 6.2 Prayer Book:** An historical and theological exploration of how and why Anglicans have met together.
- 6.3 Christian Worship:** What is the biblical meaning of worship? How will that meaning be expressed?

Stage 2 Intermediate Theological Certificate (ITC)

- 7. Old Testament 2:** Considering the former prophets from Joshua to 2 Kings.
- 8. New Testament 2:** Tracing how the risen and ascended Christ continues to achieve his gospel purposes through the events of the book of Acts.
- 9. Doctrine 2:** Who is Jesus Christ? What is the nature of sin? How did Christ's death deal with sin?
- 10. Romans:** This study opens up the central truths of the Gospel.

11. ELECTIVE 1: Choose one of the following modules:

- 11.1 Early Church History:** A look at the life of the church (its struggles, persecution and consolidation) through the first five centuries AD.
- 11.2 Reformation Church History:** The Reformation was the time when the Gospel was rediscovered. Learn how Christians found the freedom Christ brings.

12. ELECTIVE 2: Choose one of the following modules:

- 12.1 Promise to Fulfilment:** See 6.1
- 12.2 Christian Ethics:** What is the nature of ethics and morality? How do we develop a Christian ethic?
- 12.3 Prayer Book:** See 6.2
- 12.4 Christian Worship:** See 6.3

Stage 3 Certificate in Theology (ThC)

- 13. Old Testament 3:** This module considers the Latter Prophets with a special focus on the book of Isaiah.
- 14. New Testament 3:** How did Paul minister? Take a journey through Paul's letters to find out.
- 15. Doctrine 3:** Explore the nature and purpose of the church.
- 16. ELECTIVE 1:** Choose one of the following modules:
 - 16.1 Old Testament 4:** A focus on the writings with a particular look at the nature of wisdom literature in the Old Testament.
 - 16.2 Gospel and Epistles of John:** How do John's gospel and his epistles testify to the life and work of Jesus?
- 17. ELECTIVE 2:** Choose one of the following modules:
 - 17.1 New Testament 4:** An overview of the non-Pauline letters with a special focus on Hebrews and Revelation.
 - 17.2 Historical Theology 1:** This module considers significant church leaders and their contribution to the development of doctrinal understanding from the first to the twelfth century.
- 18. ELECTIVE 3:** Choose one of the following modules:
 - 18.1 Apologetics:** How do we answer people's questions about Christianity? A module on how to develop a reasoned biblical approach.
 - 18.2 Historical Theology 2:** This module considers significant church leaders and their contribution to the development of doctrinal understanding from the thirteenth to the twentieth century.

GROWING IN THE KNOWLEDGE OF GOD

What is the Moore College course?

The three parts of the Moore College course offered by the Open Bible Institute (the Preliminary Theological Certificate, the Intermediate Theological Certificate and

the Certificate in Theology) are modular distance-learning courses that teach biblical studies, doctrine, church history and much more.

Why study the Moore College course?

The aim is to equip ordinary Christians to better serve Jesus Christ and His people. God has revealed Himself by His Word: in Christ and in the Bible. Studying the Bible, theology and other practical modules leads to a deeper understanding of Christian truth, which will equip students in both Christian living and practical service.

Who can enrol?

Anyone who wants to develop their understanding of the Bible and God's truth can enrol on the course. There are no prior educational requirements. The course is



particularly suitable for those aspiring to some form of teaching ministry within their local congregation be that with young people, home groups or preaching. But it is also suitable for new Christians, those serving in more

'behind the scenes' roles and those looking for a good biblical grounding before moving into formal theological education. The youngest student registered with the UK office is just 17, the oldest, over 90.

How does it work?

At the start of each term (January, April and September), students register for their chosen modules, are sent their **study guides** and begin studying. Students usually take either one or two modules each term. A greater number can be taken but as each module requires approximately 50 hours of study, this is not generally advisable. At the end of each 10 week term, there is a two-week 'examination period' during which time each student is encouraged to sit a **module examination** which helps to consolidate understanding. Students wishing to opt out of the examinations are welcome to do so but should note that they will not be eligible for the certificates.

Usually modules are taken in the order set out in this leaflet. However, it is also possible for students to take a single module to meet a specific ministry need or for an alternative order to be agreed with the Open Bible Institute office. It is also possible for students to begin their studies before the official start of each term if they wish to get ahead with their reading or for students to study a single module over two terms if life is particularly hectic.

Many students study the course alone. However, it is also possible for a group of students in one church to meet together to offer one another mutual support and, where possible, receive tuition from a church leader. Details of how to establish a **study group** can be obtained from the Open Bible Institute office. **Results** are sent out approximately 8 weeks after the examination has been taken. Students are permitted to start their next module before receiving their examination results.
